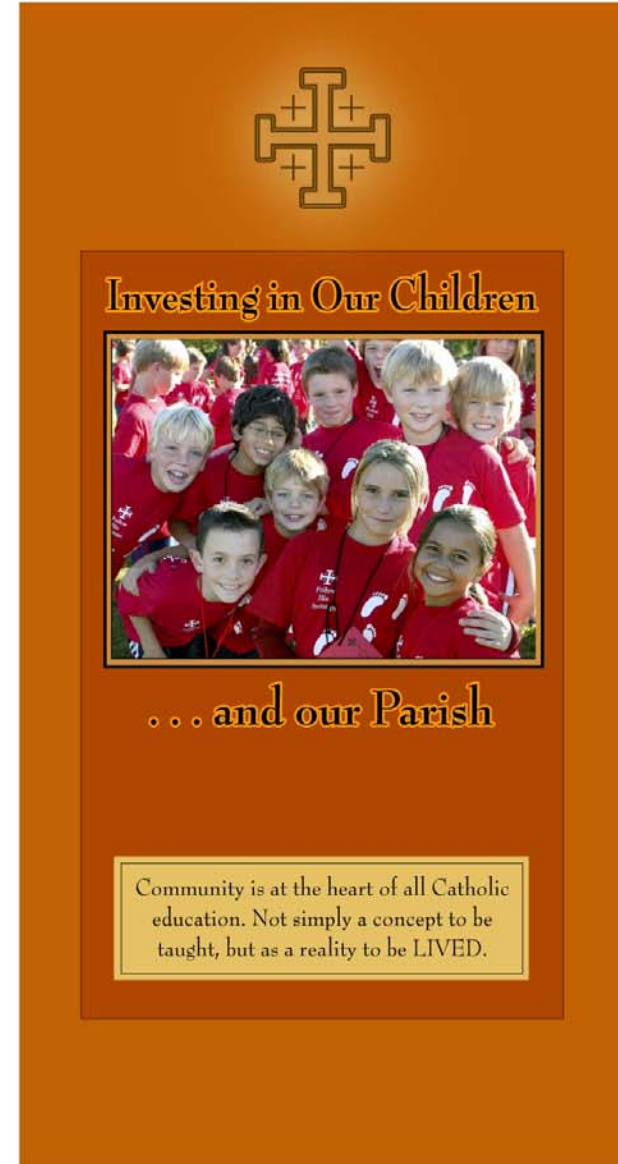
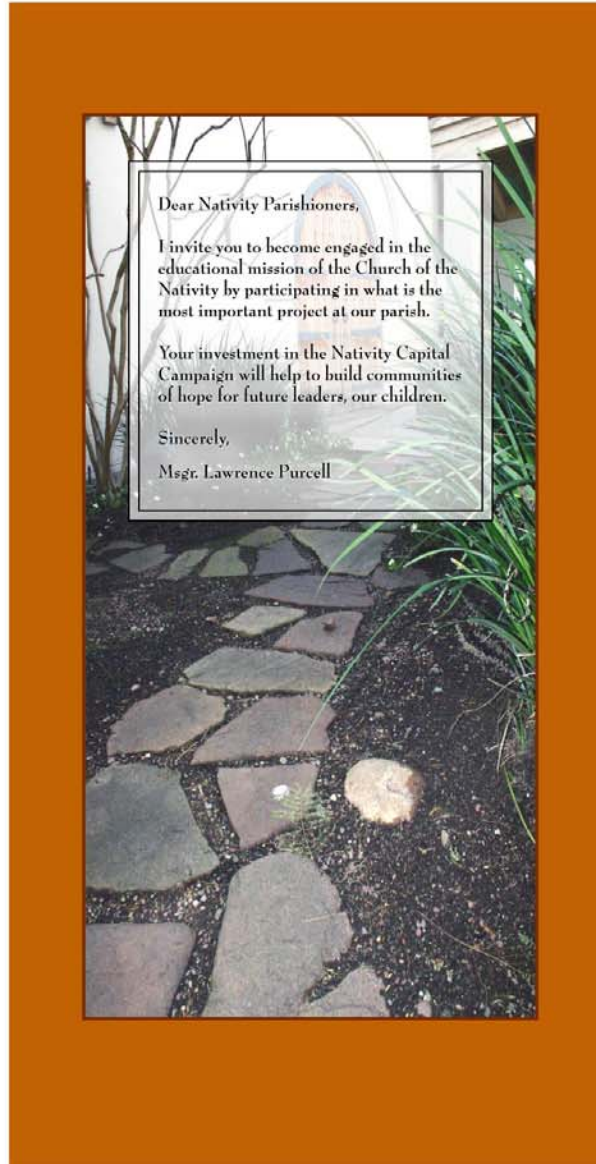

## The Nativity Capital Campaign

We have recently embarked on The Nativity Capital Campaign to fulfill three much needed initiatives: the construction of the Nativity Parish Activity Center & Science Center, our fulfillment of our parish obligation to the Secondary Education Initiative, and scholarships for San Diego County inner city Catholic Schools. This campaign provides the opportunity for the Nativity Parish to come together for three distinct missions that enhance our parish while also providing for needs within the Diocese of San Diego.

### Our Mission

Our mission is threefold.

1. To complete the original Church of the Nativity master plan by providing our own children with enhanced social skills, athletic training and education in the arts.
2. To contribute to the religious formation of teens by funding the Diocesan Secondary Education Initiative.
3. To establish scholarships enabling Catholic children to attend parish schools in the inner city of San Diego.

### The Nativity Activity Center & Science Center

The Church of the Nativity is approaching its 20th anniversary and The Nativity School has just celebrated its 10th year. Our parish and school sorely need a central gathering place for parish events, indoor sports, stage productions, and a place to stay dry in foul weather. The Activity Center will satisfy these needs. The adjoining Science Center will provide a state-of-the-art facility for hands-on science education. Together the Activity Center and Science Center will help The Nativity School to continue providing an excellent, well rounded Catholic education for our children and grandchildren.

### The Secondary Education Initiative

Over a decade ago the Diocese embarked on a program to enhance secondary education in San Diego County. With the construction of Cathedral Catholic High School much has been accomplished, yet there is more to be done. Cathedral does not receive any financial support or debt reduction assistance from the Diocese of San Diego and there are endowments for the facilities, tuition assistance and professional growth that must be funded. The support of the Nativity parish is needed to fulfill the Secondary Education Initiative and continue the tradition of academic excellence for our community.

### Scholarships for Inner City Catholic Schools

As people committed to the ministry of the Catholic Church, it is our responsibility to offer tuition assistance to worthy students from lower-income families. Accessibility to a broad range of qualified applicants will continue to create the healthy socio-economic diversity that exists in our community today. Our support will help assure that students will not be turned away from a Catholic education in San Diego County.

## Secondary Education Initiative

### Why invest in Catholic secondary education?



To fill a need:

- 1 million Catholics in 98 parishes throughout our county, and only 5 Catholic high schools in San Diego.
- Because of limited space, many families who prefer a Catholic education for their children will not be accommodated.
- The Catholic community has long subsidized tuition for worthy children from lower-income families. The Church believes that no child should be turned away from a deserved Catholic education due to lack of funds.

### Scholarships for Inner City Schools

The need has never been greater for worthy students from lower income families to receive a Catholic education in San Diego.
